Something to consider is **Parent Resource Coordinator:** that chronological age of the child may not reflect developmental age. Ashley Gunter We carefully look at the child as a whole and if they are developmentally prepared to move into an older age group. With that said, when your child turns another year older they will not automatically move up in to the next "age" classroom. We can only transition children based on the availability of space at the center. If it is decided that a child is ready to move forward, a transitional plan is developed, approved by the parents, teachers and administration, then implemented. As we move forward as a program, classroom transitions may begin to occur in a natural "cohort" type approach at certain times of the year. We will keep you updated as to how and when classroom transitions will occur. Additionally, you can look for further information in our updated Parent Handbook due out in December. There are still many exciting things to come at UCC! We continue to strive to provide the best quality care and education for your children and look forward to growing and learning together!
